

## **Important Amendments to the School Behaviour System**

Dear Parents and Carers,

6<sup>th</sup> November 2025

In order to maintain the high standards of discipline and learning expected at St. Aloysius' College, we are introducing two amendments to our behaviour system. These changes are designed to promote personal responsibility, ensure consistency, and minimise disruption to learning.

### **1. Homework Non-Completion**

From next week, any student who receives two or more 'No Homework' entries on Go4Schools within a five-school-day period will be required to attend a two-hour Headteacher Detention on the Friday of that week. The first detention will take place on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> November.

Parents and carers will be notified on Thursday afternoon based on homework data obtained on G4S. Attendance at this detention is compulsory. Failure to attend will result in further sanctions in line with the school's behaviour policy.

Completing homework on time is a basic expectation and a vital part of academic progress. This measure is being introduced to ensure all students meet their responsibilities consistently. To ensure strong academic progress and outcomes, we encourage parents to check G4S daily, and sit with their child each evening to support them completing their homework.

### **2. On-Call Removals from Lessons**

Students who are 'on called' and removed from lessons due to persistent disruption will now spend the remainder of that school day in the Learning Support Centre because persistent disruption in the classroom impacts on the progress of others which is not acceptable. This sanction will come into effect on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> November.

The classroom teacher will contact parents or carers to inform them of the incident and will hold a restorative conversation with the student before they are permitted to return to normal lessons.

These amendments form part of our continued commitment to maintaining a calm, orderly, and focused environment where all students can learn without disruption. We expect every student to take responsibility for their behaviour and learning, and we ask for your full support in reinforcing these expectations at home.
