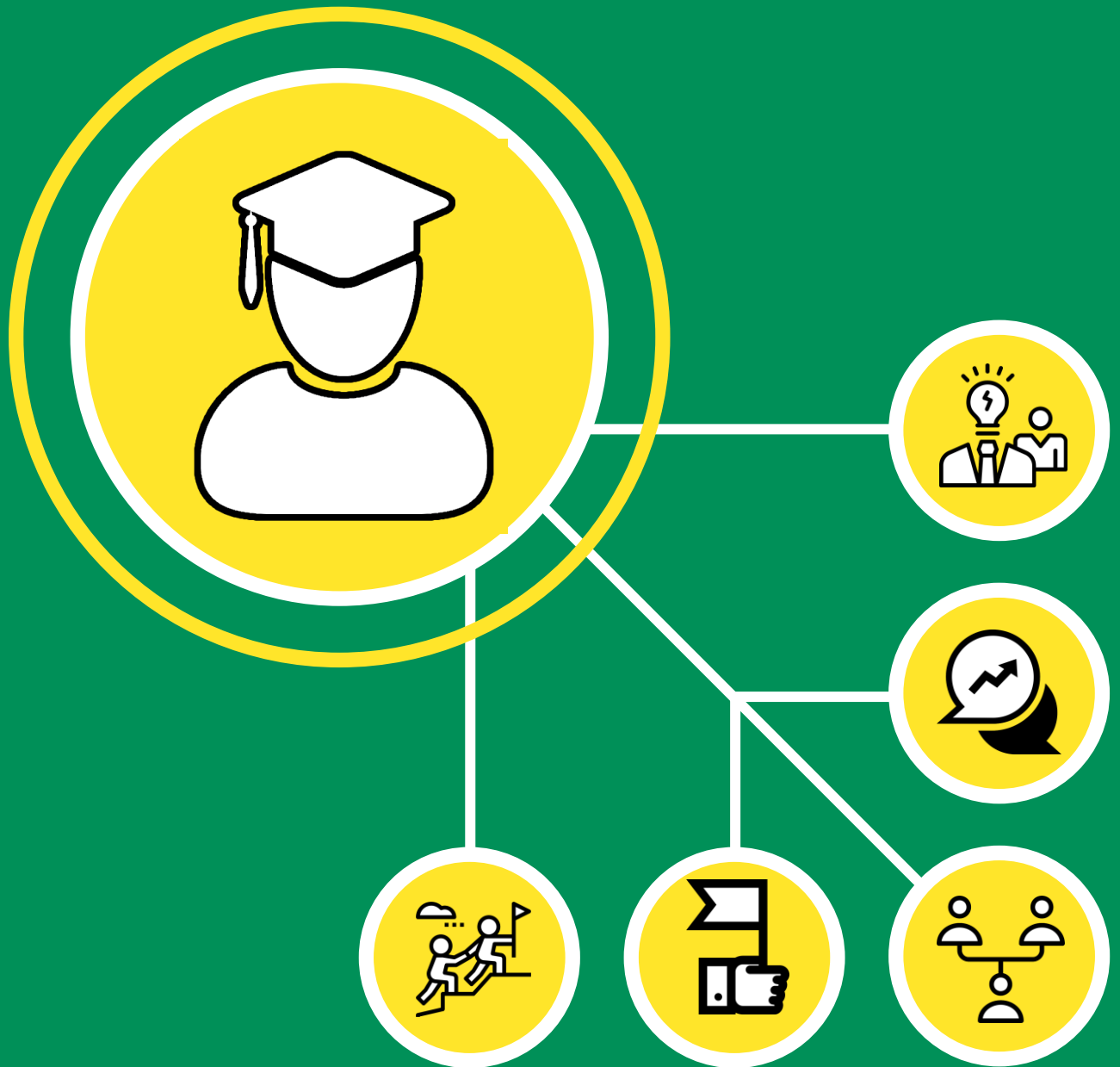

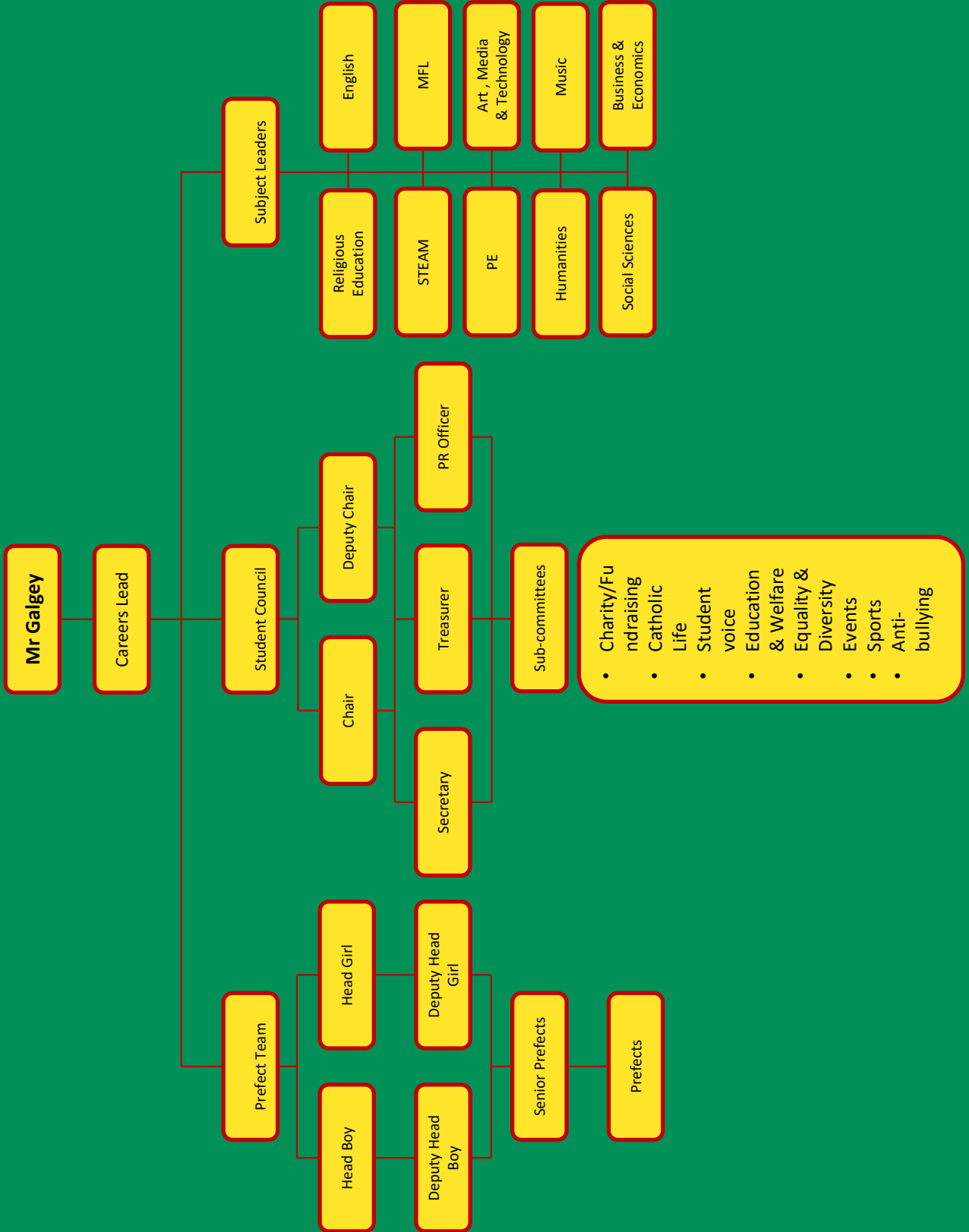
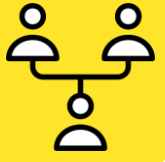
KEY GUIDANCE AND INFORMATION FOR ALL

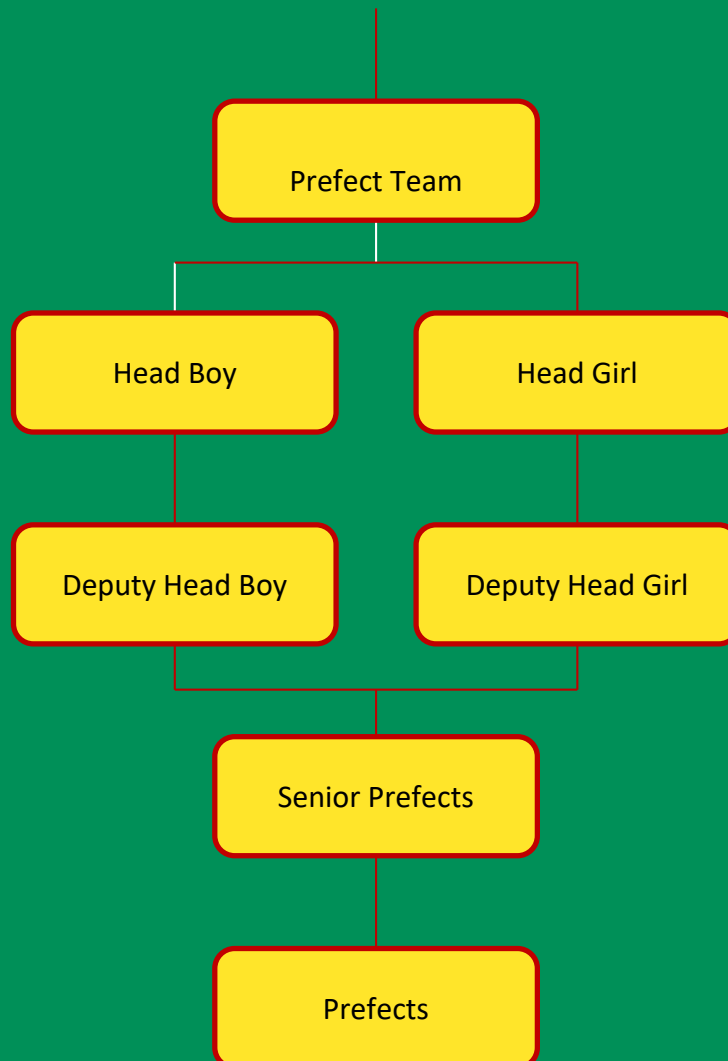


STUDENT PREFECTS

THE STRUCTURE



Purpose: Prefects should act as the **role model** for all students in the school. Prefects must **adhere** to school rules and regulations at all times. The main duty of prefects is to maintain an atmosphere of friendly cooperation, peace, discipline and unity in the school. Prefects should serve as **counsellors** to junior students.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS



LAUNCH ASSEMBLY:

Week commencing

THE TIMELINE:

- Week 1: Launch assembly
- Week 2/3: Writing of applications
- Week 4: References requested
- Week 5: Announcement of new student prefects
- Week 6: Letter of confirmation to parents



HEAD BOY/GIRL:

Students applying for head boy or head girl will have to participate in an additional process including:

- Letter of application
- Formal interview with members from the senior leadership team and the local governing body
- Year group assembly to answer questions

**Note, the new year 10 prefects will take over from the current year 11 prefects after Easter to allow the year 11 students to focus on exam preparation.*

- ✓ Any other relevant information

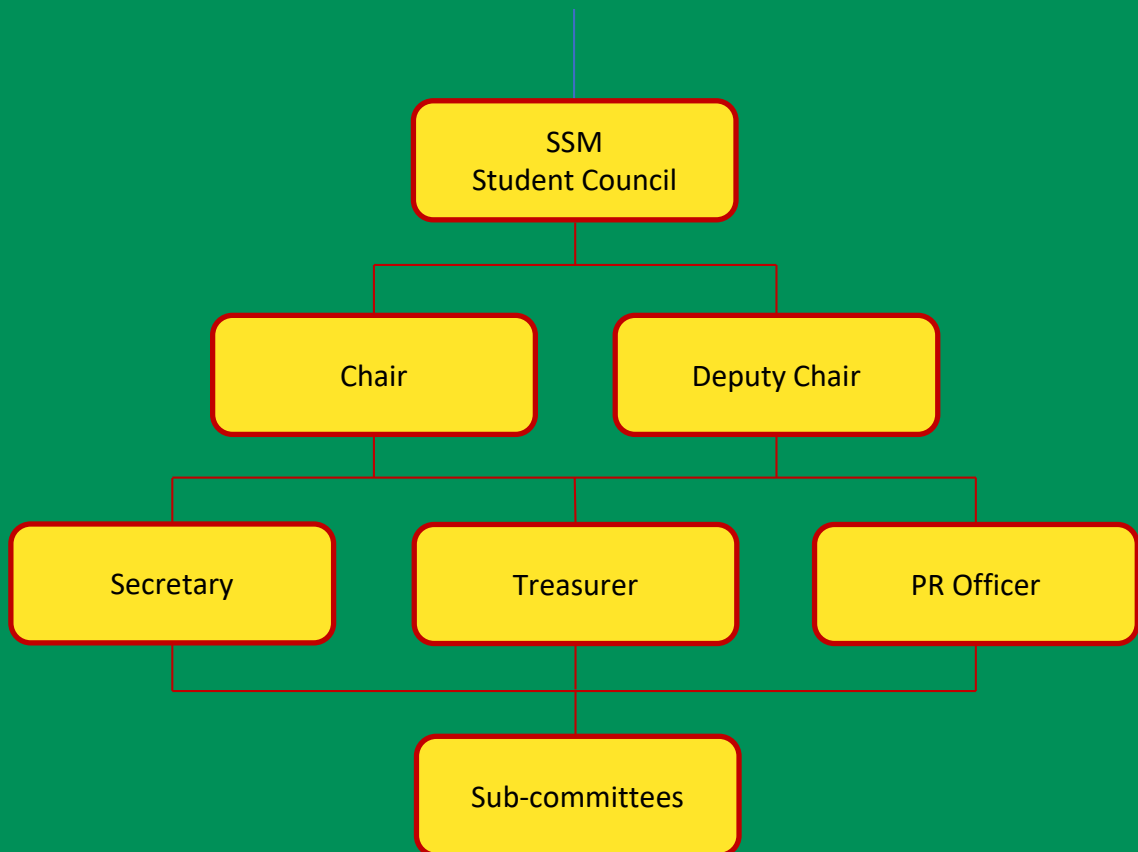


STUDENT COUNCIL

- Week 5: Student council members presented to tutor groups

- ✓ A time where you have made positive changes

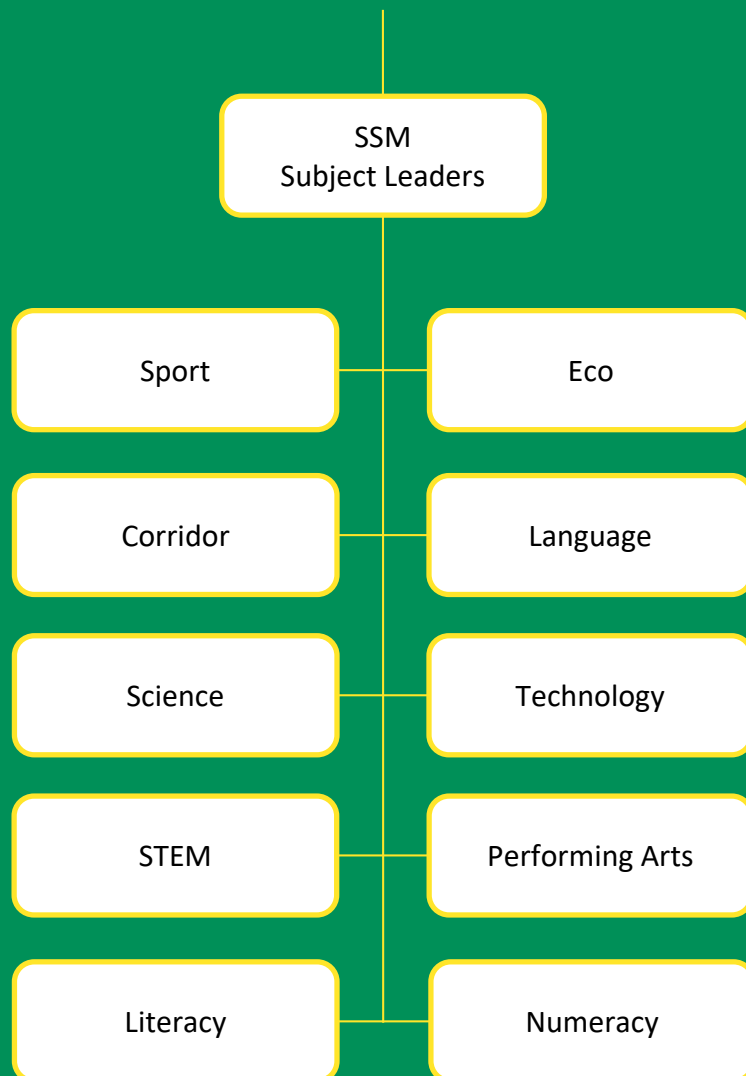


SUBJECT LEADERS
