



Behaviour arrangements during Coronavirus outbreak.

1. Introduction

The purpose of this addendum is to clarify our Behaviour Policy and procedures in the light of the recent school coronavirus outbreak.

The way St Aloysius' College is operating in response to coronavirus (COVID-19) is fundamentally different to business as usual. All the usual standards and expectations will remain in place, as outlined in the attached policy. However, a number of important behaviour principles have been modified and will be required to be followed by **all** for us to ensure that all those on site remain safe:

- Students must arrive at school in a manner that observes social distancing. No gathering or meeting up in groups prior to school is permitted.
- All students must arrive on time to ensure social distancing protocols to be implemented. · Students must comply with all COVID 19 safety measures
- Social distancing measures will be in place in line with the Government guidelines when student and staff are on site until advised otherwise. This will include restrictions on areas of the school site that students/staff are allowed to access; the use of one way systems and designated seating for each child.
- Line-ups will take place at the start of each day to remind students of the restrictions in place;
- Students must leave school and travel directly home maintaining social distancing rules.

Breaches of the School Behaviour Policy

It should be noted that the same high expectations of behaviour will be retained at this time and students are expected to adhere to our usual code of conduct. We will treat any breaches of health and safety as a serious breach of our behaviour policy and such breaches could lead to a Fixed Term Exclusion. It is expected that all students on site will:

- Follow requests to maintain social distancing immediately and without question
- Disrupt learning or impact upon the safety of others by coughing / sneezing / /pretending to be symptomatic.
- Compromising the health and safety of others by coughing, spitting or sneezing at them.

The use of the Internal Exclusion Room (LSC)

The use of the on call system remains the same as outlined in the pre COVID behaviour policy. The inclusion room will have a limited capacity and will be socially distanced. Students who are referred to 'on call' must leave the room when asked and follow the one way system to the inclusion room. Referral to the inclusion room during the pandemic will be treated as a very serious breach of the school behaviour code and could lead to a fixed term exclusion. Decisions on this will be made by the Head teacher.
